Revisit your walk audit goal

- Is your goal to capture and share information?
- Is your goal to highlight a specific need and see changes to the streets to address that need?
- Was the walk audit conducted as part of a process to make broader changes to improve walkability or bikeability near your school, in your neighborhood, or community-wide?



SHARING YOUR WALK AUDIT FINDINGS

- Share your report and conclusions with agency staff
- Present your findings at a city council, county board, or planning or transportation commission meeting
- Write up and share findings with the broader community



THINGS YOU CAN DO TO SUPPORT IMPROVED WALKABILITY NOW

- Organize a community clean up
- Organize a community event to promote walking and physical activity
- Fundraise
- Teach others to conduct walk audits and keep up the momentum
