HISTORY

- 2001 -2002 Grassroots efforts begin Working with Assemblymember Dion Aroner, Alameda County Supervisor Keith Carson, and Contra Costa Supervisor John Gioia, East Bay youth organized and talked about need for school bus pass program.
- 2002 Coalition worked with Alameda and Contra Costa social service agencies to collect data and with the Metropolitan Transportation Commission staff to develop LifeLine Funding grant proposal and lobbied MTC Commissioners
- 2002 2003 MTC commits to funding a 2-year pilot program for free bus passes for all high school youth on free/reduced lunch in AC Transit service area. Only funded 1 year.
- **2004** Included \$14.5 million of funding for "Safe Transportation for Children: Low-Income Student Bus Pass Program" in West Contra Costa County as part of Contra Costa's Transportation Sales Tax Expenditure Plan (Measure J) Measure passed.
- **2006 2009 –** MTC funds school bus passes for middle school students through LifeLine grants.
- **2009** Present School bus pass program implemented in West Contra Costa Unified School District using Measure J funding.

BUS PASS PROGRAM

- Worked with West Contra Costa Unified School District (WCCUSD) and AC Transit to develop a bus pass program.
- \$450,000 for bus passes
- \$60,000 for Administration
- 2000 high school students on free/reduced lunch receive bus passes
- AC Transit Youth Bus Pass \$20 for 31 days.
- WCCUSD 50 schools; 5 cities; 30,000 total students; 8000 high school students
