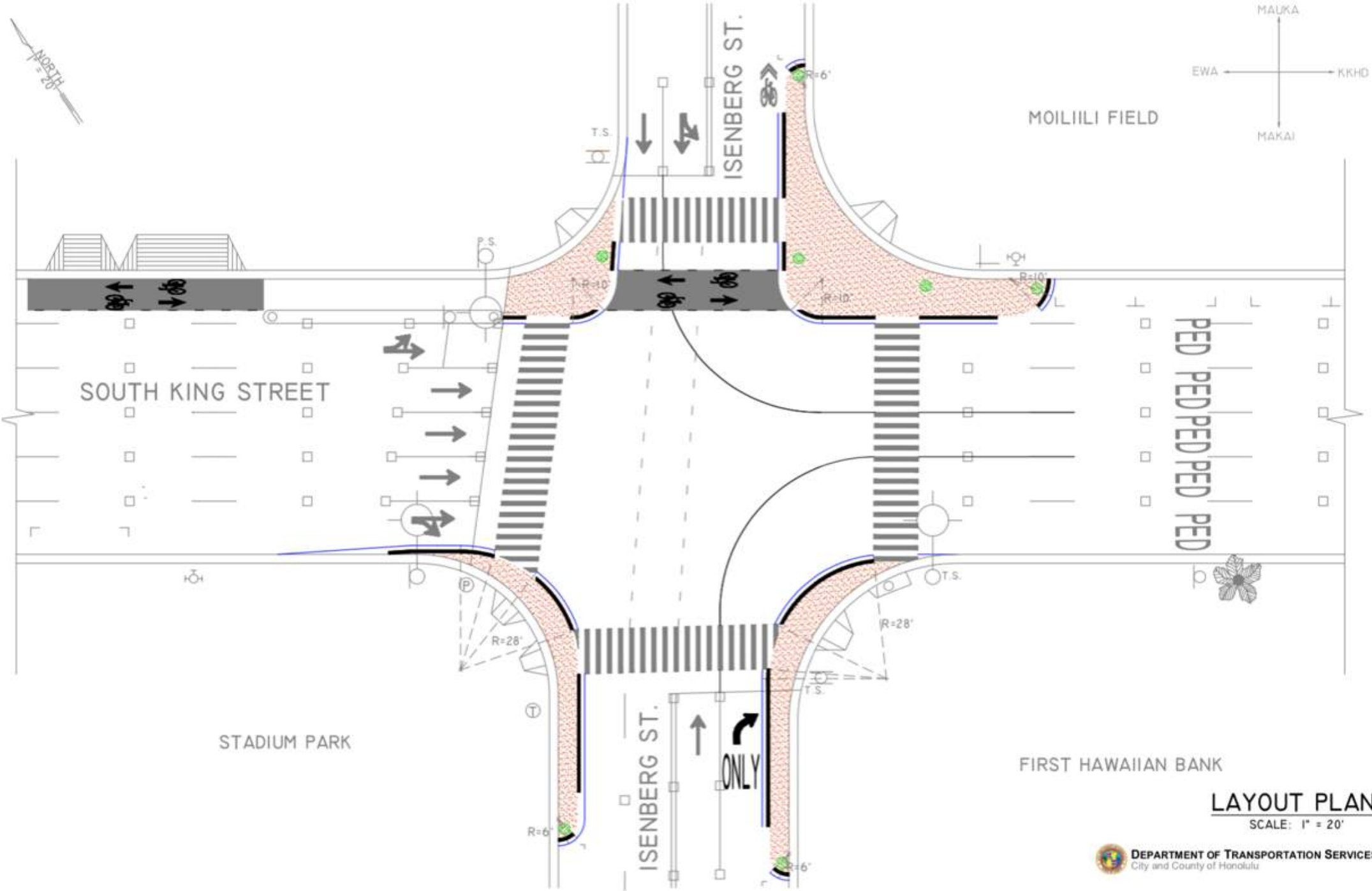

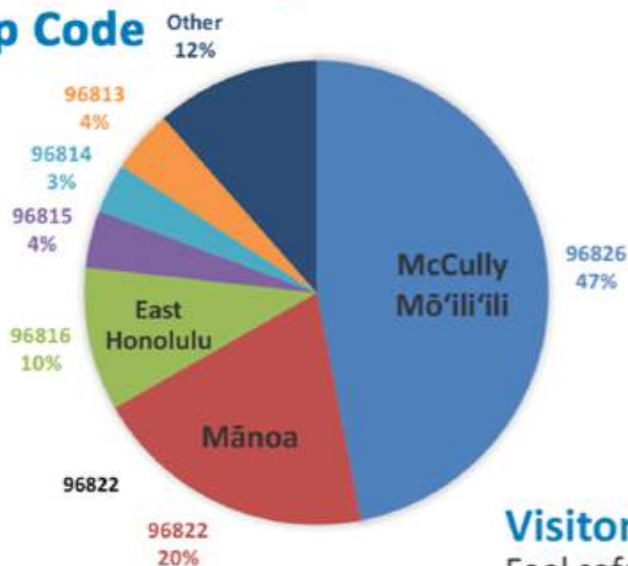
**LAYOUT PLAN**

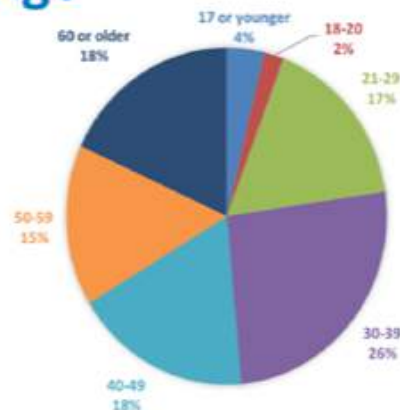

### Visit Frequency

**6%** visit daily  
**20%** visit weekly or monthly  
**74%** rarely or never visit

### Top Concerns

- 84%** Safety
- 58%** Bathroom/Facility Maint.
- 52%** Encampments
- 38%** Lack of Visual Appeal

**90%** of respondents agree that revitalizing Old Stadium Park is very or extremely important

### Visitors want a park where they can...

Feel safe (**87%**), enjoy the outdoors (**55%**), spend time with family/friends (**43%**), and exercise (**42%**)

### Top Interests

1. Improve general park cleanliness
2. Renovate pavilion & bathroom facilities
3. Improve lighting and accessibility
4. Restore drinking fountains
5. Improve visual appeal with landscaping

**92%** of respondents who rarely or never currently visit Old Stadium Park would visit if the issues mentioned above were addressed

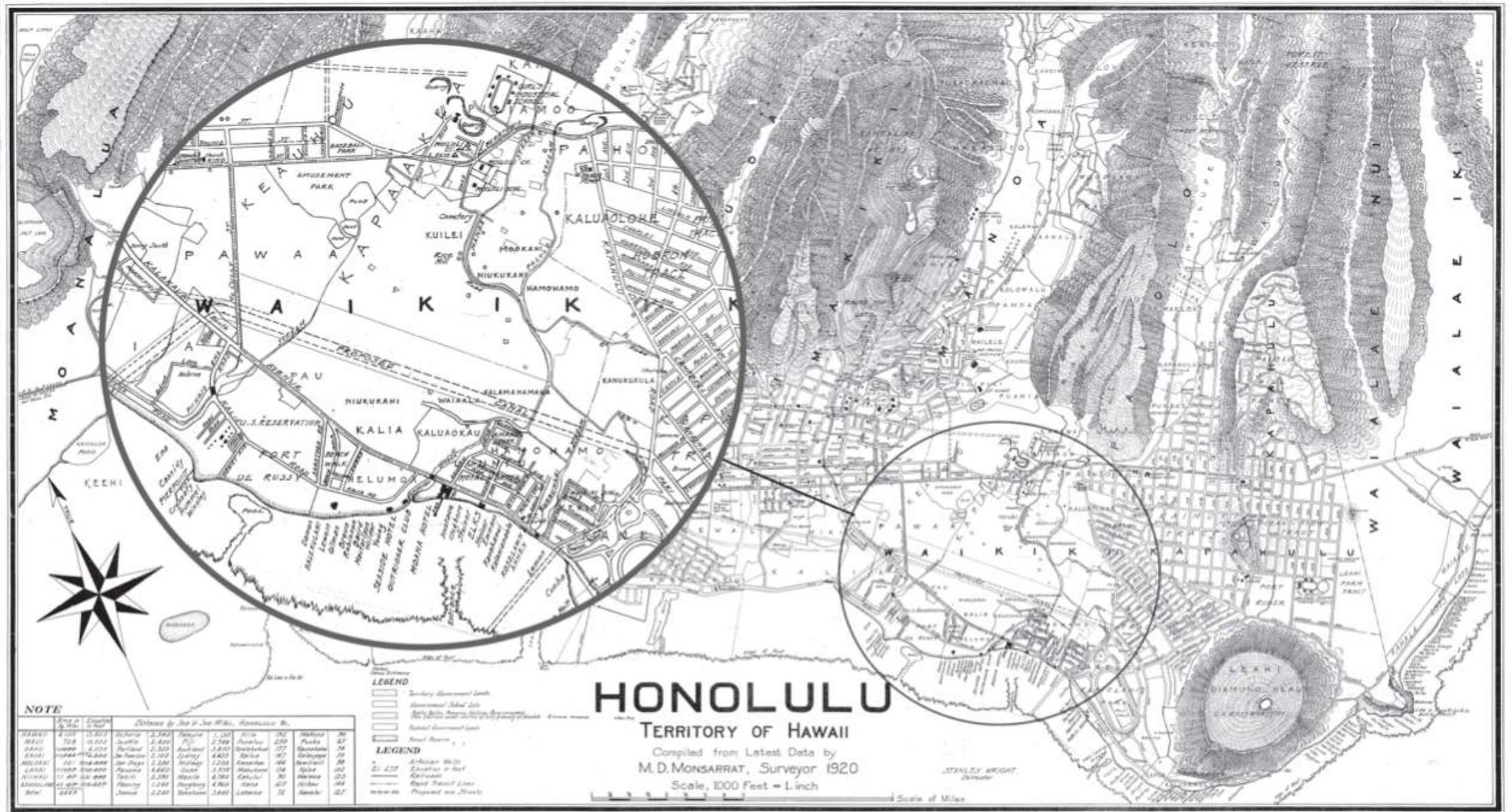

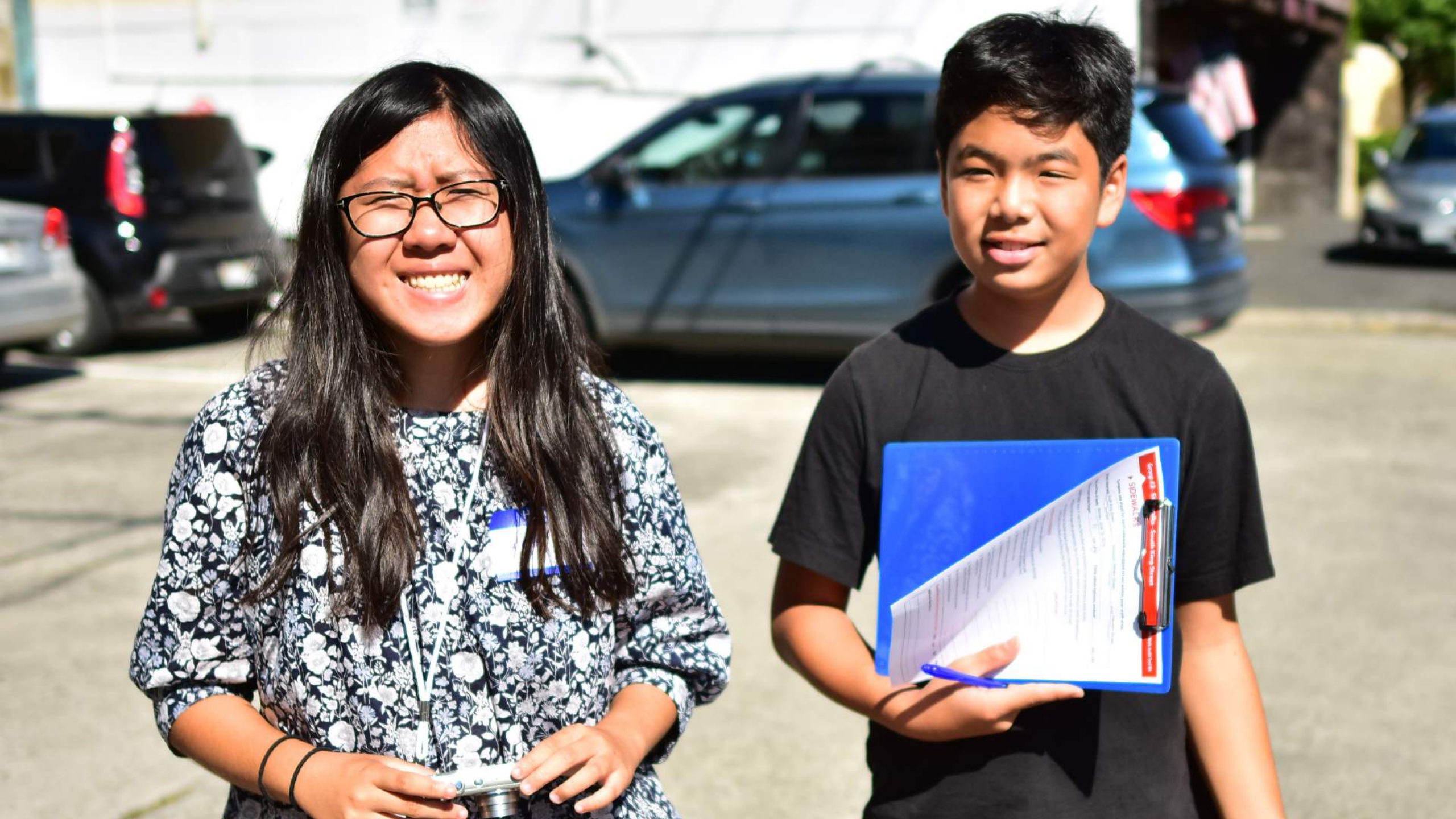


1902 Oahu Historic Map Alexander

Water features - take advantage of naturally flowing water flow + filtration/clean water

green roofs for pavilion

## VALUE-ADDS OF THE BULB OUTS

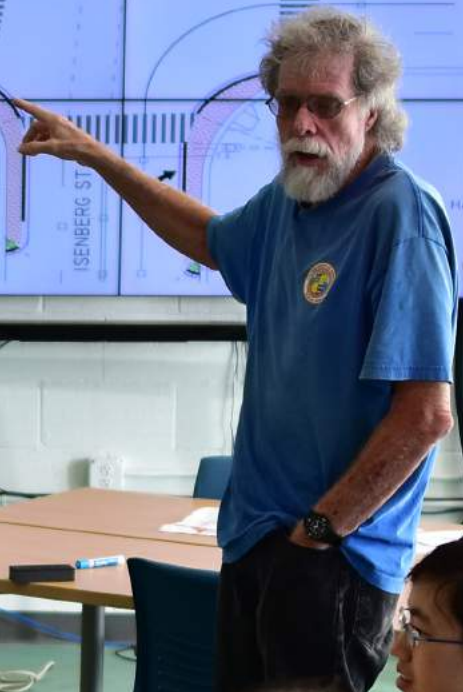

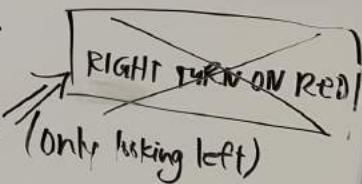

## HACKS/HELPS

- right/better plants for planters in bulb-outs
- Cars get "right of way" currently - crosswalk defaults
  - ↳ need pedestrian "right of way" to red and ppl still walk
- Crowded sidewalks
- broken sidewalks
- no ramps
- trees in bulb-out or by crosswalks
- neon flags for crossers
- 1-way vs. Right of way walkers
- speed limit signs posted more frequently
- end of King St. speedway - can we reduce speed from further down
- alleviate/hack multi-lane crossings (cars and bikes)
- bike route is inconvenient/circuitous
- texture in the paint for rainy days

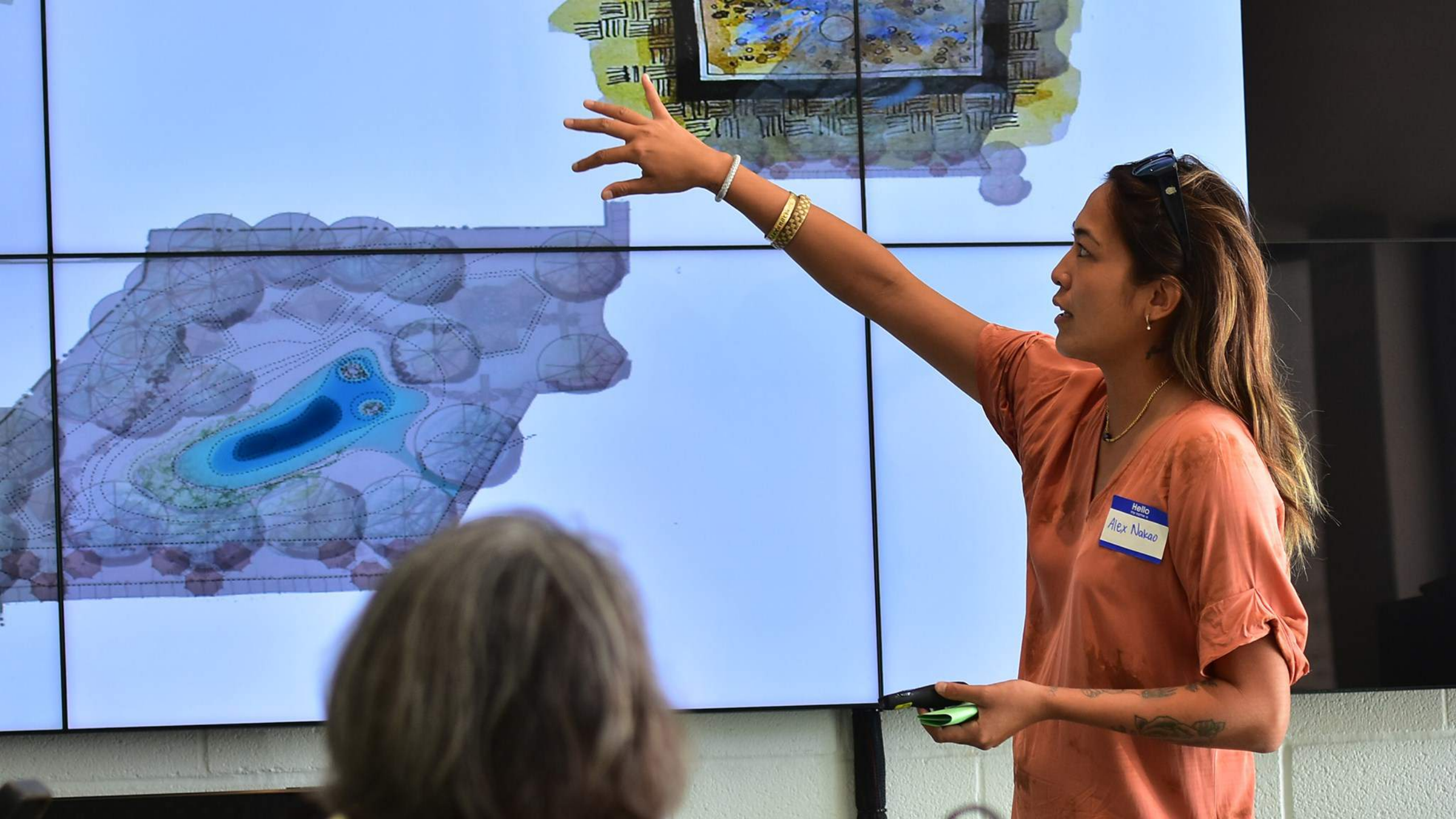

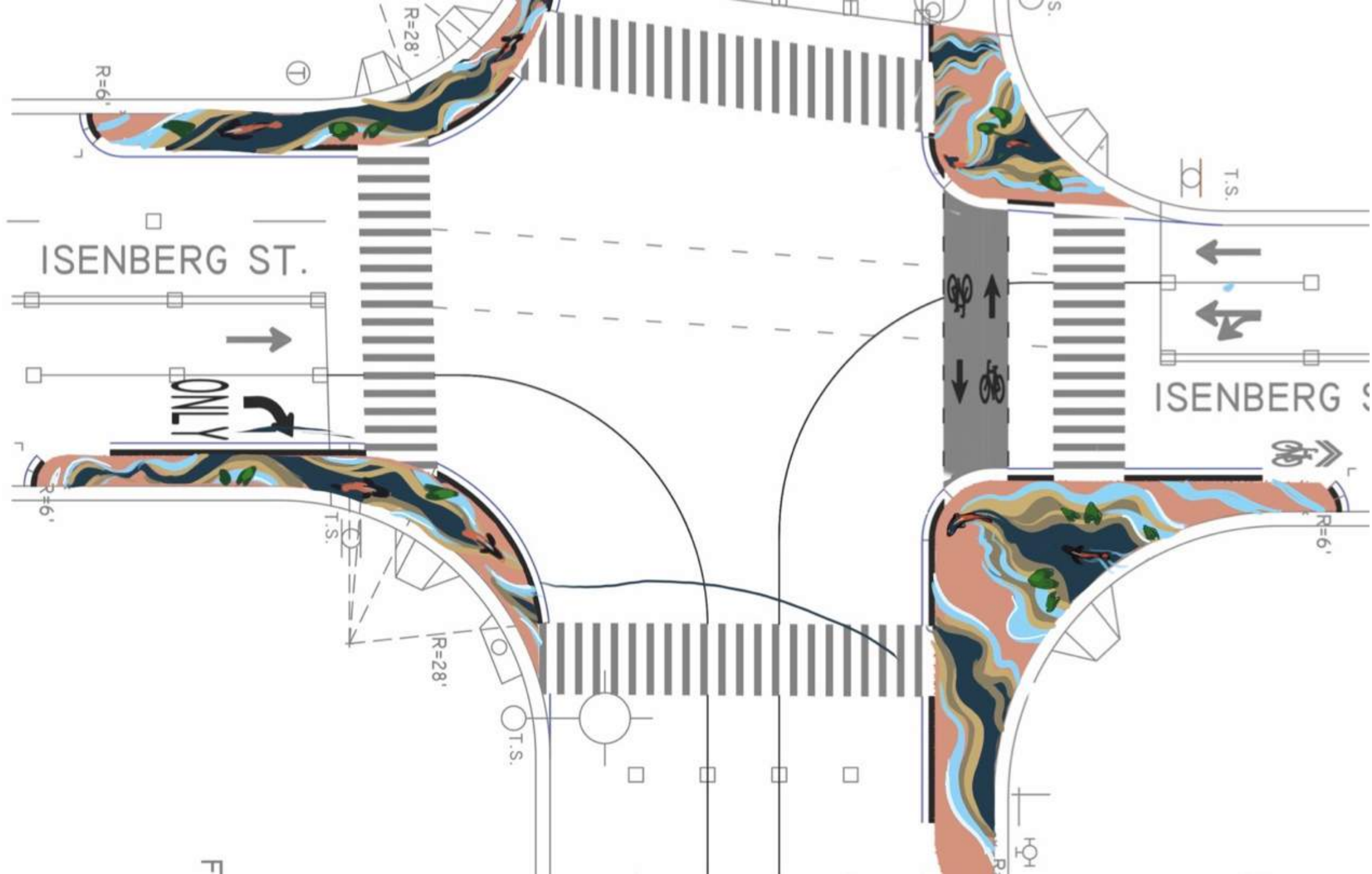

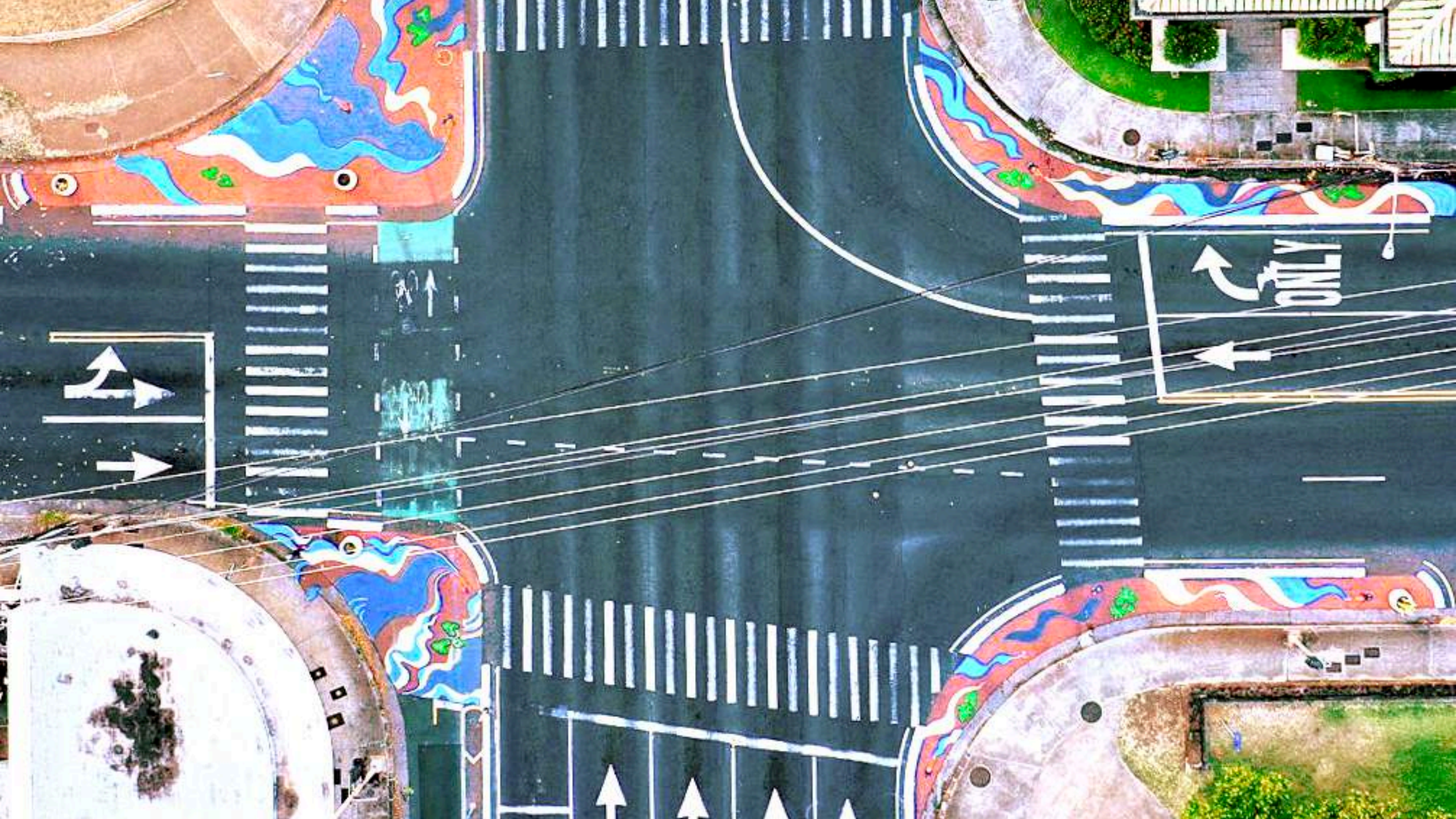

# Lessons Learned

- 1. Know the approval requirements** (permits, approvals, etc.)
- 2. Be respectful, yet persistent with public agencies**
- 3. Get key politicians involved**
- 4. Show that the community supports your project**
- 5. Textured traffic paint dries quickly, thin it out**
- 6. When storing paint, use high-quality containers**
