

- 12 counties, 44 local governments, 85 board members
- 1.4 million people in MPO area
- Diversity of geographies and constituents (urban/suburban/rural)





MPO Governance

- Policy Committee
 - Elected & appointed officials
 - Transit agencies
 - Citizens Advisory Committee chair
- Transportation Advisory Committee
 - Engineering staff from local governments
- Citizens Advisory Committee
 - Geographic representation: central city, inner ring, etc.
 - Transportation disadvantaged or underserved
 - Pedestrians/bicyclists, environmental, health, historic preservation advocates
 - Business



Funding

- Total infrastructure funding: \$33.6M/yr.
 - 2-year cycle
 - Most recent funding round: \$258M in requests, \$64M available >> \$194M shortfall
- Surface Transportation Program (\$21M/yr.)
 - Bike/ped projects eligible
 - All projects must comply with Complete Streets Policy
- Congestion Mitigation & Air Quality Program (\$10.5M/yr.)
 - Bike/ped projects eligible
 - Has been used for bikesharing in some cities
- Transportation Alternatives (\$2.1M/yr.)



Transportation Alternatives

- Similar process for MORPC under MAP-21
- Most project requests are for bike/ped infrastructure (trails, sidewalks)
- SRTS being handled jointly by MORPC and Ohio DOT
 - ODOT providing 100% funding; MORPC: 80/20
- Applications accepted in 2-year cycles



Active Transportation Planning

- Regional Collaboration
 - SRTS forums
 - Trail forums
 - Regional ped/bike staff coordination
 - Data warehouse
- Encouragement: Bike/Walk to School Day, Car Free Day
- Regional network planning
- Regional bike/ped counts
- Count equipment library







Opportunities

- Complete Streets Policies
- Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP)
 - Nearly doubled from \$1.3B to \$2.4B/yr.
 - Ped crashes are focus area for many states
- Surface Transportation Program & CMAQ
 - MPOs are member-driven
- Partnerships
- Flexible funding available through work program
 - Bike/pedestrian counting, development of resources, regional coordination, research, evaluation
